WE FACED THE GIANTS AND EMERGED VICTORIOUS!

Dear Friend,

The past year (2021-22) has been a giant-facing experience – particularly the first half of the year! Come April, and there was death and fear all around. We felt ill-equipped to respond to the great need around us with respect to COVID relief! But we did not give up. As the Delta variant struck the nation, and the numbers began to rise beyond anyone's imagination and preparation, we had but one choice – convert our rented school facility into a COVID care center and our staff had no choice but to turn patient caregivers, ambulance drivers, counselors, and delivery staff whose only job was procuring oxygen cylinders filled (sometimes at the wait time of 28 hours) and delivering them to all places far and wide in the Delhi NCR region!

Delta & death were the giants this year, but team LTF did face them furiously, risked their lives, and served thousands through the process! You will read the details of our COVID relief work in the pages of this report.

Together with the support of our volunteers and donors, we did emerge victorious with our due share of sorrow and grief of losing some of the people we served during the peak of covid – including two family members of one of our staff!

Thousands of fellow Indians were fed meals, given dry ration kits, covid medicines, and multivitamin tablets and tonics, and hundreds received financial relief along with collaborative efforts to help several villages and towns in the region.

Through all of this, we are proud that our educational activities did not stop. Instead, the year witnessed smooth operation of our Evening Online School (EOS), with an over 85% success rate!

A lot more work happened across the homeless & differently abled, women & widows, medical & healthcare, and food & nutrition, as summarized in this report.

I wholeheartedly commend the entire staff of LTF, who were resilient, bright, brave, and brilliant in both their attitude and action! Kudos to the team!

We also appreciate and thank every volunteer and donor whose contribution enabled us to continue serving humanity throughout the year.

The prevailing poverty and injustice move us from within to radically respond to the needs of the poor, the forgotten, and the marginalized people of India. In other words, simply put,

To nurture, educate and empower the underprivileged people of India by providing them the environment and resources that propel their all-around development and growth, for their total well-being, resulting in nation-building.



WHAT WE DO



EDUCATION

LTF runs a high-quality, English medium school for children from the underprivileged and lower-income group community in the city of Gurgaon, National Capital Region of Delhi, India. LTF currently educates 100 plus children in LTF School, with a plan to start educating 1000 children across Delhi NCR & beyond.



LTF also assists patients who need urgent medical attention for the treatment of life-threatening diseases. We envision starting a community clinic & diagnostic center followed by a 100-bedded multi-specialty hospital, which will also function as a home for the dying destitute to provide care for those in the last days of their life, especially those suffering from terminal illnesses and are beyond treatment. We seek to give all such people the dignity, compassion, care, and love that they deserve.



FOOD & NUTRITION

LTF frequently provides cooked meals and dry rations to people in need, especially during the pandemic and other relief programs.



WOMEN & WIDOWS

LTF cares for womenfolk in the community and provides assists them provision of hygiene materials, clothes, multivitamins, etc. LTF specially cares for the widows through its widow support program.



HOMELESS & DIFFERENTLY ABLED

LTF provides food, clothing, shoes, blankets, etc. for the homeless throughout the year. LTF also supports monthly rations for 16 visually impaired students in Delhi.



EMERGENCY & RELIEF WORK

LTF actively responds to emergencies and engages in relief work in situations like fire & pandemics like COVID-19. This involves the distribution of all kinds of relief materials ranging from meals to medicines.

Communication with children & parents during lockdown

Children were not coming to the school due to COVID- 19 induced lockdown and restrictions. Due to this reason, during the months of April to June, the project administration staff regularly contacted all the parents of the students, once every 15-20 days to check on their well-being, and their status (whether they were in town or in their hometown/village). During these calls, they would share their experiences and struggles during uncertain and difficult times. We realized that many of them were financially affected. Some of them even returned to their village as they were unable to make ends meet!






330 Learning Hours at Evening Online School (EOS)

As the covid cases were rising, the government did not allow schools to reopen. The team decided to start an Evening Online School (EOS) via zoom, to ensure continuity of learning for our children. Every evening, the parents would return home from work and handover their devices to the children for the online school, which saw an 85% success rate! The others could not attend online school for want of a smartphone device at home.

The EOS ran for the most part of the school year and was a great success. Our teachers did a brilliant job teaching children online despite all the limitations and sacrificially gave their evening hours for children.







Staff visiting children's homes

A couple of times during the year, our staff took the initiative to visit the homes of our school children to see their progress and to see if they were facing any challenges concerning their online studies. The students and parents were surprised and happy to see us face to face after a long time.







Online Staff Training

A half-day online staff training was organized for the teachers of LTF on the topic "Education for the Underprivileged – The Problem and a Solution." Mr. Elisha Patel, an educationist was the speaker. The training was very useful in understanding the problem concerning education of vulnerable children.







Books & Learning Material Distribution

LTF's admin staff visited children's homes to distribute books and other learning material to help them study and learn.







In-person School Reopens

Since COVID cases were declining, the government allowed schools to open. It was a big relief for us. We welcomed all the students on 8th November 2021.

It was a joy to see the students back in school, laughing, enjoying, and learning together. It was a beautiful reunion!


Shifted the School to a bigger and better place.

ALL LABOR OF LOVE MAKES A DIFFERENCE, EVERY SEED SOWN BRINGS FORTH FRUIT



Nandini had never been to School and stayed with her aunt in Gurgaon! Our small center was the only 'school' she had been to, and Mrs. Kuttickal was the only teacher she had. She learned the basics under Mrs. Kuttickal, and then, sadly, she had to go back to her village!

Fast forward 8 years. Our Founder & Managing Trustee met her one evening at another student's house and found that she was now in Class X in a small private School in Agra!!

We were overjoyed seeing Nandini's progress and seeing where her love for learning took her! Hats off to her spirit, and commendable job by Mrs. Kuttickal, who is now the Head of Academics at Life Tree Foundation!

This beautiful story reminded us that every seed we sow into the lives of others will bring forth some fruit!

Jeewan Sahayak Covid Care Centre

....when LTF School became a 'hospital' and our classrooms became patient wards

During second (Delta) wave of the COVID pandemic, millions of lives were endangered as medical help was not adequately available, hospitals ran out of beds, and there was severe shortage of oxygen and other medical resources all over the country! We personally witnessed the grave situation and were grieved by the loss of lives, many of whom we personally knew!

This situation birthed the idea of converting our rented School building into a COVID care centre which was named "Jeevan Sahayak COVID Care Centre".













• 16-bedded facility served 70 patients in all in 2 months

Jeewan Sahayak COVID care centre was set up as a 16 bedded facility for mild to moderate cases of COVID with round the clock nursing care available in it and a doctor visiting daily/every other day as per need. Through the centre, LTF was able to help more than 70 patients with regular check-ups, regular doctor visits, oxygen support via cylinders and oxygen concentrators, and ambulance services.

Dr. Bithia Jerome used to come on centre rounds. She would speak to the patients once a day on video and visit every other day. We appreciate the pains she took treating our patients despite her long hour shifts at Medanta The Medicity, Gurgaon.









32 cylinders, 12 concentrators & 2 ambulances deployed

32 cylinders were deployed for community service, which were filled repeatedly after waiting in queues for long hours, sometimes for as long as 28 hours, and were rushed to people who called us in distress at our 24 x 7 helpline number. The volunteers demonstrated extraordinary courage and passion to serve those in need in supplying oxygen to patients as a stop-gap arrangement until they found beds in hospitals.

Patient care staff and ambulance drivers were on the job 24 x 7 for the two busy months of the Delta wave.

27000 masks distributed

LTF distributed 27,000 plus masks all over Delhi & NCR to the needy and the underprivileged, people living in slums and on the footpath and those of the medical fraternity.

Of these, 2000 KF94 masks were given to the frontline workers during this pandemic who were working day and night.





300 COVID care kits across 40 villages

300+ medical kits and oxygen concentrators were given during the pandemic across 40 villages in Delhi, Uttar Pradesh & Haryana.









Setting up of COVID care Centre in Bainsi Village, Rohtak, Haryana

The center welcomed people from 4 villages. LTF team installed 2 concentrators and provided PPE kits and other materials for the center. The local leaders welcomed the move and were grateful for it.





Helping equip a rural hospital in Jharkhand

LTF's rural COVID outreach continued and through it a consignment of COVID and general medicines was sent to a rural hospital in Jharkhand. We were also able to send them nursing trolleys, wheelchairs, stretchers etc.

The doctors prescribe medicines, but it is the nurses that nurse the patients with these medicines and take care of them.

LTF was also able to help 10 different individuals in helping pay for their medical treatment financially. The help comes from our Life Support Fund.







Nomita, a domestic worker, come to Jeewan Sahayak COVID Care Center one morning in a critical condition, with an oxygen level of 64! She was critical. She was immediately put onto oxygen support, and our volunteers then put her in the ambulance and drove her pillar to post for 8 hours, before finally getting her admitted to a government hospital for further treatment!!

It was a herculean task for the volunteers to get her RAT tested, get the report, go to the Civil hospital, get the referrals and then wait and plead at ESI for hours together, before seeing success!

Finally, she was in the hospital. We felt so satisfied doing this for someone who had no one in the town who could run around for her.

Today, she is hale and hearty and visits us to meet us and say "Thank You!"







IMPACT STORY 2

Mr. Fardeen Das, Ghaziabad

Discouraged, he called us for help. Lost his parents to COVID, was in depression and himself COVID positive. No salary for the last 2 months which took him starving. Needed oxygen.

A concentrator was immediately delivered.

He did not have money to buy food and medicines, LTF helped. He was also a heart patient.

After 2 months of struggle, he became better and returned the concentrator!

4631 families given ration kits

Prolonged lockdowns and restrictions led to millions who were losing jobs and were pushed to hunger!

Throughout the year, several women were provided with pre-used clothes which were donated in clean and proper condition. The ladies always appreciate this activity, that we frequently undertake.










KF94 mask given to ASHA workers

One of our team members knew her and told us her story of how she has not been able to procure basic ration needs for her home.

LTF decided to support her with a monthly pension. We got to know later how the pension amount has been a consistent help for her. She spends it all on buying monthly rations.











800 homeless people given blankets

This year during winter we were able to give blankets to 800 people living in the open, under the flyovers, roadsides, bus stands and railway stations in different parts of Delhi and Haryana. We believe in quality and accordingly only good quality blankets were given. We were glad we could give blankets to those who did not have adequate warm sheets or blankets to keep them warm in cold and freezing winter!













5000 used clothes distributed

LTF organized a clothes mela for the homeless people and slum dwellers who cannot afford to buy new clothes and remain content with old & torn away clothes more often than not. LTF posted an ad on social media and to our donors, and the response was overwhelming! We were able to collect 5000+ used clothes and household items, and the team of LTF was able to donate them to people living in different slums of Gurgaon, Haryana.









Monthly ration to blind school for 16 people (all 12 months)

LTF supports a blind school cum hostel in Delhi with monthly rations where 16 blind students stay and study. Some students are in 12th class while others are pursuing higher education from Delhi University. Besides, they are also completing their computer training and getting trained in playing musical instruments.

700 slums gutted in fire!

Fire Relief in Nathupur, Gurgaon

On 4th April 2021, 700 Shanties were gutted in a fire in Nathupur Gurgaon. Incidents of gas cylinder explosions were also reported during the fire incident, as per a fire official. However, the fire was later brought under control with the help of around 12 fire tenders in a six-hour-long operation.

As soon as we got to know about this the team of LTF jumped into action to provide fire relief in Nathupur. Dry ration packets, cooked meals, utensils, bedsheets, and other household items were given as fire relief and towards the rehabilitation.















35 slums destroyed by fire!

Fire Relief in Berhampur, Gurgaon

On 8th Feb 2022, at least 35 shanties were gutted in a fire, which broke out in the slums of Berhampur village in Gurugram Sector 59 on Monday morning, police said, adding that no casualties were reported. However, shanties of most of the 35-odd families living there were burned down in the fire, which the fire department and police said could be "a case of electrical short-circuit".

Dry ration kits, utensils, and household items were distributed as fire relief in response!


