LTF SCHOOL

(Formal): LTF runs an English medium school for vulnerable children in Gurgaon, which currently educates more than 120 children who come daily for 5 hours of learning, creativity and exploration!



CHILD DEVELOPMENT

(Non-Formal): LTF also runs child development centres (CDCs) to provide bridge courses for the unschooled, dropouts & tuitions for after-school children of government schools.

LTF also creates educational awareness.



YOUTH DEVELOPMENT

(Non-Formal): LTF soon plans to launch skills development centres for the youth for vocational training, personality development, grooming, spoken English, motivational sessions, counselling, career guidance & mentoring.



MEDICAL & HEALTHCARE

LTF assists patients who need urgent medical attention for treatment, specially widows and orphans. LTF conducts health awareness seminars for all and menstrual hygiene awareness programs among women.



HOMELESS & DIFFERENTLT ABLED

LTF provides necessities such as food, clothing, blankets & basic household items for the homeless & differently abled. LTF also supports a hostel for the visually impaired with monthly rations.



WOMEN & WIDOWS

LTF cares for the wellbeing of women and assists them in the provision of hygiene material, clothes and multivitamins; and provides monthly pension and motivational support to widows.



EMERGENCY RELIEF & RESPONSE

To meet the necessity of food, LTF provides cooked meals and dry ration kits to people in need, especially during pandemics and other calamities such as fire in the slums.



FOOD & NUTRITION

LTF actively responds to emergencies and engages in relief work in situations like fire & pandemics like COVID-19. This involves distribution of all kinds of relief material ranging from meals to medicines.



RECOVERY & REHAB

LTF also engages in the recovery & rehabilitation of affected communities by supplying them with provisions such as material for reconstruction of slums, utensils, LPG cylinders, stoves, mats, bedsheets etc.



LIFE TREE FOUNDATION SCHOOL (FORMAL EDUCATION)



NIOS Accreditation

After undergoing several visits and inspections, Life Tree Foundation School received NIOS (National Institute of Open Schooling) affiliation on March 29, 2023. This accreditation is a significant achievement for the school, indicating its commitment to providing education. The students will take exams under the guidelines of NIOS and receive government certificates.



Teachers' Enhancement Program and Staff Training

From May 23rd to May 31st, 2022, Life Tree Foundation School conducted programs to enhance the basic computer education skills of teachers. Staff training programs were also organized to educate them about child protection rights and how to be empathetic and effective educators. These initiatives ensured that teachers were equipped with the necessary knowledge and skills to create a safe and supportive learning environment.



School Expansion

The school has been expanding gradually, adding one class each year. In the financial year 2022-23, the school has extended its offerings up to Grade 4. Mural painting was done on the school premises.

Basic Computer Skills

Recognizing the importance of computer literacy in today's technologically advanced world, Life Tree Foundation School prioritizes teaching basic computer skills to students at the primary level. By equipping them with these skills early on, the school prepares them for the digital age.







Quarterly Assessments and Parent-Teacher Meetings (PTMs)

To evaluate the progress of students, the school conducts quarterly assessments. Additionally, four PTMs were held smoothly, allowing for open communication and strong relationships between students, teachers, and parents. These interactions contribute to maintaining the quality of education and fostering a supportive school community.







Competitions

Healthy competitions were organized namely Rakhi making competition, Origami Completion, poem recitation completion, storytelling competition & and handwriting competition. These competitions were summed up to be very helpful for the children to be involved, being actively participating & showcasing talents by the exhibition of their own traits. Students were encouraged through prizes and certificates.







Celebrations

Students celebrated Independence Day, Children's Day, Sports Day, Diwali, Christmas and Republic Day.

Independence Day celebration

75th Independence Day was celebrated on the school grounds. 112 students with teaching staff and the LTF team gathered as audience and participants. Mr. Mohan, Additional SHO, Bajghera, along with his team of 20 police personnel attended special guests. They encouraged the students with their kind words. Ms. Deepa George & and Mr. Prashant Kuttickal (Trustees) with our former school head Ms. Reena Kuttickal also came and met the children.



Sports Day

LTF students participated in sports such as the lemon relay race, newspaper relay race, balloon relay race, puzzle relay race, etc. The local councilor Ms. Sunita Yadav & RWA members encouraged the kids. Members of the Robinhood Army came and gave refreshments.







Foundation Day & Teachers' Day celebration

5th September is celebrated as Teachers Day and is a significant day as it is the foundation day of Life Tree Foundation as well. The whole team congratulated each other. The teachers were given picture frames and a small token of love. The whole team celebrated both events with gratitude.







Learning with Fun

Activities conducted by Ms. Shreya and a team with 6 other volunteers along with students to participate in such fun learning activities, breaking activities, musical lessons, and arts and crafts sessions with educational and engaging games.

Experiential learning

Students observed the partial Solar Eclipse conducted by Space Technology and Education Pvt. Ltd. The event took place under the supervision of the RWA members of Palam Vihar.









Exposure Events

Tata Communications field visit

The students of Life Tree Foundation were invited to "REFLECTIONS" - a global employee volunteering campaign. Children participated in the mentoring sessions with the employees on "the importance of education". The students went to the premises and had an experiential visit in regard to the work culture. Students were pumped up and started dreaming of working in Tata.





Dental camp conducted in the month of February 2023

The dental camp was held at the premises of Life Tree Foundation school in collaboration with Prakash Manchanda & and Dr. Hemraj Memorial Trust's Project I-Smile Charitable Dental Clinic. The experienced team of doctors came along with the whole required setup to conduct the dental investigation for the children. A workshop on Oral hygiene and maintenance habits was also done among the kids.







STORY OF CHANGE DELIVERING HOPE AND HAPPINESS

Background

A 3-year-old child named Pranshu's life took an unfortunate turn when he lost his mother to COVID-19, leaving him with a father suffering from severe mental illness who lives in the village. With no one in the family willing to take responsibility for Pranshu's education and future, his maternal aunt became his last hope. She approached Life Tree Foundation – considering an NGO, to provide Pranshu with an opportunity for education and a better life because his education was too heavy for her family.

Our Intervention: The school immediately welcomed Pranshu with an open heart. An assessment was conducted to understand Pranshu's educational needs and emotional well-being. Based on the evaluation, it was decided to provide him with admission to the nursery class, covering his educational expenses, including uniforms, books, and stationery, free of cost. Counseling sessions were organized for Pranshu, offering emotional support during this challenging period of loss and transition. They ensured that Pranshu felt welcomed, loved, and supported within the school community.

Results and Impact

- **1. Educational Opportunity:** With the support of the school and the NGO, Pranshu gained access to quality education that would have otherwise been out of reach for him. This opportunity opened doors for his future development and growth.
- **2. Emotional Well-being:** The counseling sessions provided by the school and the NGO proved to be instrumental in helping Pranshu cope with the loss of his mother and adjust to his new environment. He gradually began to express himself more openly and connect with his peers and teachers.
- **3. Joy of Learning:** Pranshu's transformation from being reserved to becoming an enthusiastic learner showcased the power of a nurturing educational environment. His curiosity and dedication to learning brought joy to his teachers and peers.
- 4. **Inspiration to Others:** Pranshu's story became an inspiration for other children and families facing similar challenges. It emphasized the impact that collective efforts and compassionate support can have on a child's life.

This case study serves as a reminder of the importance of extending a helping hand to those in need, giving them hope and opportunities to thrive in life.





Pehla Kadam Bal Vikas Kendra (Non-Formal Education)



Pehla Kadam Bal Vikas Kendra started by educating 50 underprivileged dropout/ unschooled children to prepare the children for formal school in accordance with the national education policy 2020. The non-formal education project supported the children to train them according to their age and intellectual capacity to help them get admitted for formal education. The children were provided with the required stationary, school bags, etc. The children were taught life skills, and basic hygiene and prepared for tests required for admissions.

The project started with the core objectives:

- To educate the dropout and unschooled children.
- To increase the enrolment of students in formal school.
- To increase access to quality education for children.
- · To change the life condition of poor children through education.

It started with the mobilization process and ended with mainstreaming with the involvement of the module to help the students in bridging the gap in their learning process. All the students were mainstreamed in the government school and Life Tree Foundation School.



Results and Impact:

- 1. Children's Academic Success: Children's progress was remarkable, and they regained their confidence and enthusiasm for learning.
- **2. Empowering the Community:** The project not only benefited the children but also influenced the attitudes of parents and the community towards education. Many parents were encouraged to prioritize education, leading to increased enrollment in schools.

All the students were mainstreamed, and the success of this project has inspired continued efforts to bring positive change to the lives of vulnerable children, proving that with determination and compassion, dreams can be achieved, and lives can be uplifted.

STORY OF CHANGE THIRST FOR KNOWLEDGE

Background

Priyanshi's thirst for knowledge was evident during her time at a government school in her village. However, personal and financial constraints forced her to drop out and they came to Gurgaon to earn their living. Priyanshi and her mother continuously started coming for admission but because of her age and the level of education, she was not admitted to formal school.

Our Intervention

Both mother and daughter along with 19 more children and parents kept coming to find solutions for education. Their thirst for knowledge moved our hearts, and a special project to address the needs of dropouts and unschooled children called Pehla Kadam – the first step towards education. The project was solely to start special classes to educate dropout and unschooled children. The children were taught life skills and value education too. They started implementing the value of education and life skills in their lives and parents were proud to discuss the changes they were witnessing in the day-to-day lives of their children.

Results and Impact

- 1. Children's Academic Success: Children's progress was remarkable, and they regained their confidence and enthusiasm for learning.
- **2. Empowering the Community:** The project not only benefited the children but also influenced the attitudes of parents and the community towards education. Many parents were encouraged to prioritize education, leading to increased enrollment in schools.

Specialized programs aimed at enhancing the well-being of individuals facing challenges. Following the outbreak of COVID-19, it has brought about a transformation in the lives of many, fostering improved wellness across the community.

Medical & Healthcare

With a primary emphasis on addressing illnesses, and injuries, and preventing health issues through the promotion of well-being, these programs were carried out:

- Medical treatment support
- Gallbladder surgery.
- DVT Treatment.
- Carcinoma breast cancer treatment.
- Recurrent cholangitis treatment.
- Women's health & and hygiene seminars

Health talks were conducted with 120 slum ladies at Nathupur Village. The topics of the Health talk were "Menstrual Hygiene" and the following subjects were covered:

- Menstruation A Taboo in India
- Understanding menstruation
- Risk of poor menstrual Hygiene
- Best practices to manage menstruation
- Do's & Don'ts related to menstruation







Homeless & Differently Abled

Support to homeless and differently-abled due to emergent, accidental, and situational causes.

Monthly ration support to 16 visually impaired students

The visually impaired students are pursuing their education at different levels. These students have gained confidence and independence, allowing them to pursue their dreams and aspirations without the barriers of their disability.







3000 used clothes distribution

In the months of June and October, a clothes distribution drive was set up in both the targeted communities, Nathupur & and Sarai. The distribution involved 3000 used clothes such as T-Shirts, Shirts, Pants, Lower, Dresses, etc. The drive was conducted in the residential area of the stated regions consisting of weak-built housing units.







Women & Widows

• Monthly financial support to 20 widows - The aim of the scheme is to provide financial assistance as a monthly pension worth Rs. 1000/- to widows on a monthly basis.



- Ration support to 22 widows In the month of May, ration support was provided to 22 widows from the neighborhoods of Sarai, Gurugram, and Haryana. The ration Kit contained whole grains such as cereals, pulses, rice, sugar cooking oil, etc.
- Women's health & hygiene seminars On the occasion of International Women's Day, an event was conducted in Sarai village with 60 women and girls participants with the main speaker Dr. Bithia Jerome.



She stated the following points with a brief explanation:

- Importance of women's hygienic habits.
- Usage of hygiene products and in-detailed explanation about menstrual health cycles.
- Usage of basic sanitation facilities.
- Diseases and illnesses are caused by a lack of proper care.
- Kits promoting better health & and hygiene practices were distributed.

STORY OF CHANGE ROAD TO RECOVERY



Background

Kanchan Kerketta, a resilient woman, faced a significant health challenge in the form of gallbladder stones. Her husband, working as a housekeeping cleaner, could not bear the burden of medical expenses. Life Tree Foundation stepped in to provide financial support, offering Kanchan a second chance at regaining her health.

Life Tree Foundation's Intervention: Upon learning about Kanchan's critical health condition, LTF swiftly assessed the situation and extended a helping hand. Understanding the urgency of the surgery, the Foundation decided to provide the necessary financial support to ensure Kanchan's timely treatment.

Results and Impact

- **1. Restored Health:** Kanchan's successful gallbladder stone surgery, made possible by the Life Tree Foundation's support, allowed her to regain her health and well-being. She experienced relief from the pain and discomfort caused by the medical condition.
- **2. Relief from Financial Burden:** The Foundation's financial assistance alleviated the financial burden on Kanchan's family. It provided them with peace of mind, knowing that they could focus on her recovery without worrying about medical expenses.
- **3. Able to work again:** After treatment, she resumed work and was able to support her family.

This story serves as a testament to the power of compassion and collective efforts in creating a caring and supportive society, where individuals are given a second chance at health and hope.

Food & Nutrition



Our focus is on serving the community by providing sustenance to thousands who, due to various reasons, face challenges such as malnutrition and weakened immune systems, making them susceptible to illnesses and diseases. This segment is dedicated to generating opportunities to support individuals dealing with these issues and raising awareness about their needs.

7500 meals on 75th Independence Day

India completed 75 years of independence in 2022. To celebrate the proud moment, Life Tree Foundation organized a meal program in the outskirts of Delhi and distributed 7500 hygienic & and nutritious cooked meals in the nearby slums of Nathupur, Sikanderpur, Sohna, and Pataudi. Children, the elderly, women, rickshaw pullers, drivers, and daily wage workers were benefited by the drive.





Emergency Relief & Response

Ration distribution for fire relief response

The ration distribution to the survivors of the fire crisis in Pataudi village, Manesar. 65 families were provided essential food supplies for a month as an aid. The ration kit contained multi-grain flour, cereals, pulses, spices, etc.

Relief to Chasola fire-affected survivors

More than 200 shanties were gutted in a massive fire that broke out in a local slum near Ghasola village in Sector 49 area on Monday. As over 150 small and big gas cylinders burst into fire, it spread rapidly with smoke filling up the sky. More than 20 fire engines were pressed into service and it took over 4 hours to control the fire. However, over 200 shanties were burnt by then. Fortunately, nobody was hurt.

Several families lost their valuables, including TVs, refrigerators, money, jewelry, and important documents.

On 21st Jan 2023, Life Tree Foundation supported the affected 250 families by the means of providing utensils and other essential household items such as rice pots, frying pans, curry pots, cups, rice and curry spoons, mats, mugs and buckets.





Recovery & Rehabilitation

This program helps crisis survivors through recovery and rehab initiatives.

A heart touching story

The deceased, Matias Minj, hailed from Beltoli in Jharkhand and used to work as a driver in the city. The family had been living in the apartment, meant for the economically weaker sections (EWS), since the past four years.

Urmila Minj, wife of the deceased went to work around 9 am. Her husband and both sons were at home. The boys were studying on the terrace around 11:30 am while her husband was resting in the flat. Everything was alright when she left. There was no electrical problem and she already cooked food. She received a call from one of her neighbours during working hours that her flat was on fire, then she left her work and returned home.

Trapped in a small area while trying to hide himself from the flames by staying in a small corner where the family members used to sit while she cooked. There was an electric plug there, acc. to the sources, a short circuit triggered the fire causing the entire flat being caught on fire and the other flats were also damaged by the flames. The door was locked from inside and the fire- fighters had to break it open.

Life Tree Foundation supported the family members by the allocation of 2 beds, necessary utensils, a sofa, a study table, bed sheets, a pillow, and a blanket along with school necessities such as school supplies and water bottles. The mother continues to be the only breadwinner of the family.
